With over 14,000 sq m space in 4 large exhibition halls and a large open air section, and the new NorthSeaConventionCentre (NordseeCongress-Centrum) with its numerous function rooms, New Energy Husum 2011 will offer a complete overview of the renewable energy sector. Traditionally, over 60 percent of the visitors are trade visitors.

Small wind turbines – the trend topic of the regenerative sector

Small wind turbines have become the trend topic in the regenerative sector, and New Energy Husum has become the leading trade fair for this world wide industry.

With over 50 international small-wind exhibitors and several lecture events on all four days, New Energy Husum 2010 was the central public forum for this booming segment of the renewable energy sector. Experts and exhibitors from many regions of the world were agreed that this has become the most important international market place for small wind energy.

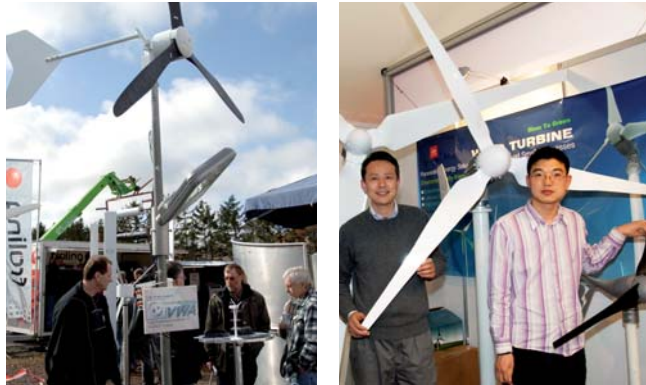


New Energy Husum 2011 – host of the 2nd World Summit on Small Wind turbines

The 1st World Summit on Small Wind Turbines with speakers and participants from more than 20 nations was extremely well received. The high-calibre forum definitely confirmed New Energy Husum's position as the internationally accepted Mecca for the small wind turbine sector.

In 2011, New Energy Husum will be once again be host to the 2nd World Summit on Small Wind Turbines. This is once again being organised together with the World Wind Energy Association (WWEA), and is taking place on 17 and 18 March 2011.

For two whole days the focus will be on small wind turbines and their various applications, especially with regard to the emerging nations. As WWEA chair Anil Kane explained at Husum in 2010, it is especially in those regions of the world without a universal power supply grid, that small wind turbines can give broad sections of the population access to electricity, thus opening up massive development potential.
